



MOE and MINTA sign Internet service agreement

On Monday this week, Ministry of Education Secretary Mr. Gary Ueno and Marshall Islands National Telecommunications Authority Executive Vice President Mr. Yoshi Kaneko (seated above, right and left, respectively) signed an Internet Service Provider (ISP) agreement that will improve connectivity for the Ministry. The agreement governs the quality of service and payment terms for a new 20Mbps Business Leased Line that is being provided by MINTA to MOE.

Both entities agreed that MINTA will be responsible for the ISP connectivity from MINTA to the Ministry's "demarcation point," which is the Information Technology (IT) office.

RMI OLPC Project


